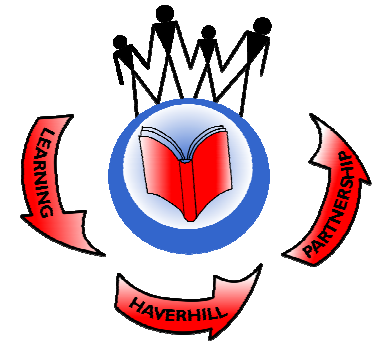

Post 16: Admissions policy

Aim: To provide access for all students to suitable post 16 courses.

Entry requirements:

Pathway 1: Have shown a level of commitment to studying. Be willing to fully attend and participate in the life of the College. Several GCSE qualifications at grade D/E are required to follow the access programme.

Pathway 2: To follow this pathway a student must have an average point score of 4 and the required grade at level 2 to study the level 3 course. (course details will provide subject specific information). Students must have shown a good level of commitment to studying. Be willing to fully attend and participate in the life of the College

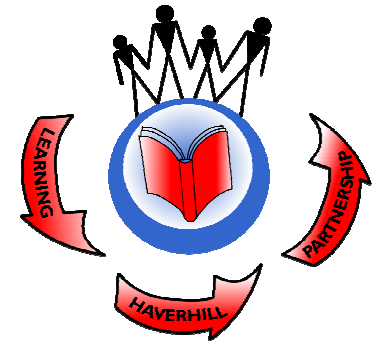
Pathway 3: To follow a level 3 programme with a considerable vocational element a student must have achieved 5 A*-C grades and have an average points score of 4.5. Subject specific criteria must also be met, some subjects recommend that a grade B at level 2 is needed to study that subject at AS level. Students must have shown a level of commitment to studying. Be willing to fully attend and participate in the life of the College.

Pathway 4: To follow a level 3 programme largely based on A Levels a student must have achieved 5 A*-C grades and have an average points score of 4.5. Subject specific criteria must also be met, some subjects recommend that a grade B at level 2 is needed to study that subject at AS level. Students must have shown a level of commitment to studying. Be willing to fully attend and participate in the life of the College.

Post 16: Admissions policy

Admissions Process:

Step1: Yr 11 questionnaires complete (Oct JW&MH) - information to staff/preliminary staffing analysis

Step2: Yr 11 assemblies advertising pathways evenings CM,SW, LVC (Dec/Jan JW&MH)

Step3: Joint Pathway evenings (Jan 15th &16th, JW&MH)

Step4: Pathways Booklet and website available to students (Jan 15th JW,MH,PR,RB&DC)

Step5: Students complete the application process deadline 8th Feb (JW&MH)

Step6: Interview process begins 21st Feb (JW&MH)

Step7: Timetabling process begins 21st Feb, subject blocks developed, clashes processed (GH&JK)

Step8: Letters confirming a provisional place sent out March (JW&MH)

Step9: GCSE results released, August confirmation of places (JW&MH)

Step10: Yr 12 induction programme Sept (JW&MH)
